In 1923, with the help of Professor J. B. Finnegan and other members of the faculty, the initial steps for founding an honorary fire-protection engineering fraternity were taken. The initial chapter was composed of seven men. Its purpose was to foster high scholarship and incite original investigation in all phases of its branch of engineering.

The primary requisite for membership is high scholarship. However, to qualify for membership the candidate must show evidence of superior abilities through his activities and must possess a strong character.

A news letter, the "Deflector," is published annually by the organization. In it is contained news of its alumni and of the active chapter. Regular meetings are held throughout the year. Two initiation smokers are held, one in the fall and the other in the spring of the year.
