
OF ELECTRICAL ENGINEERS

He delivered an interesting talk on the use of carrier currents in telephone work, and traced through the various types of circuits employing carrier currents that have been used since the idea was first introduced.

A talk was given by Mr. Levy, assisted by Mr. Probst, on the dial type of telephone manufactured by his company, and illustrated by a demonstration with equipment. These men are engineers with the Automatic Electric Company. Mr. Levy traced the diagram of connections, and discussed the various types of relays used in the instrument. In connection with this topic, he had a group of relays mounted on a board. These could be energized to show their principle of operation.
