The Interfraternity Council was organized in 1927 for the purpose of controlling the relationships between the ten social fraternities at Armour Institute. The Interfraternity Council is the successor to the old Interfraternity Rushing Committee.

The purpose of the Interfraternity Council has been to bring about a closer relationship between the fraternities and also between these organizations and the Institute. This group handles all matters of common interest such as interfraternity sports, sing, scholarship, rushing, pledging and initiation rules.

The council proper is made up of the presi-

dents of each social fraternity on the campus, thereby giving each fraternity an opportunity to voice its opinion on matters of common interest.

In an effort to better establish the rushing regulations this year it was decided to publish a Handbook, the purpose of which was to acquaint the freshmen with the histories of the various fraternities on the campus, as well as to inform them of the rushing rules. This proved of great value, both to the men desirous of joining a fraternity, and to the fraternities themselves.
