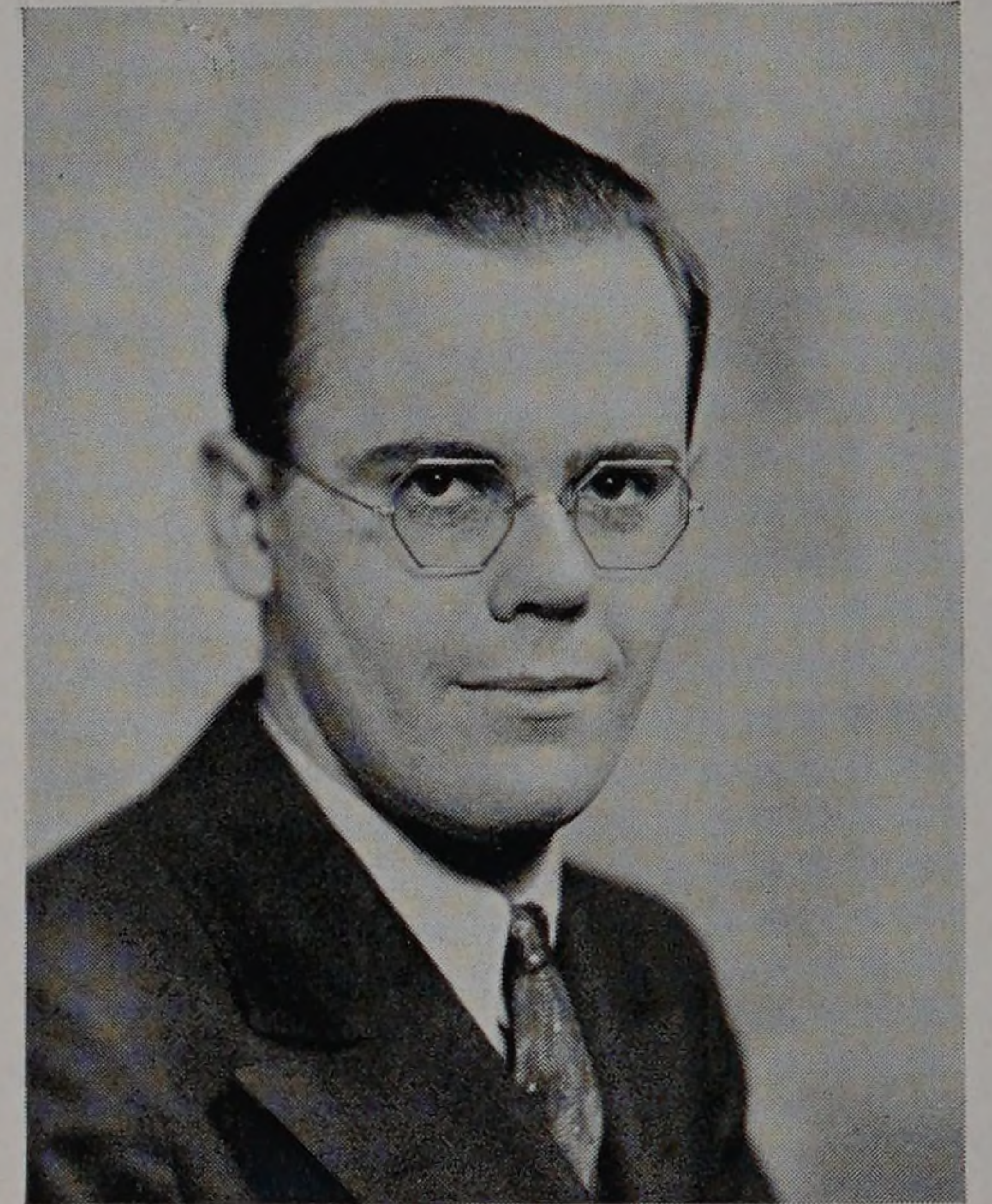


ARMOUR BRANCH OF THE AMERICAN
