# HISTORY

Sphinx, honorary literary society, was founded at Armour Institute of Technology on March 4, 1907. It developed from an organization formed by the members of the staffs of the "Fulcrum," a former monthly publication, and the "Integral," the Armour yearbook whose name was later changed to the "Cycle." The society was originated with the purpose in mind of fostering and promoting the work of the Armour publications and of serving as an honorary society for services rendered the Institute through the student publications.

In 1909 the first "Armour Engineer" was sponsored by Sphinx, and in 1928 the organization and launching of the school's first weekly newspaper, the "Armour Tech News," was backed by this literary society.

Membership has been granted to 254 men at Armour Institute. Senior and junior students who hold executive positions on the staff of any of the three recognized publications at Armour and who have done work of a high character and have shown exceptional ability over a period of two years, are considered for membership.
