### HISTORY

Phi Pi Phi Fraternity was organized at Northwestern University in 1915, and since that time has had a very rapid growth. It now has a chapter roll embracing groups in twenty colleges and universities.

The history of Gamma chapter is a record of the local chapter of two fraternities, namely, Beta Phi and Phi Pi Phi, and of the assimilation of the former by the latter. The Armour Beta Phi chapter, Gamma, was established at Armour in March, 1913, and after the War dwindled the national organization to one remaining chapter, Phi Pi Phi was petitioned. On November 24, 1923, the Armour organization was installed as Gamma chapter of this national group.
