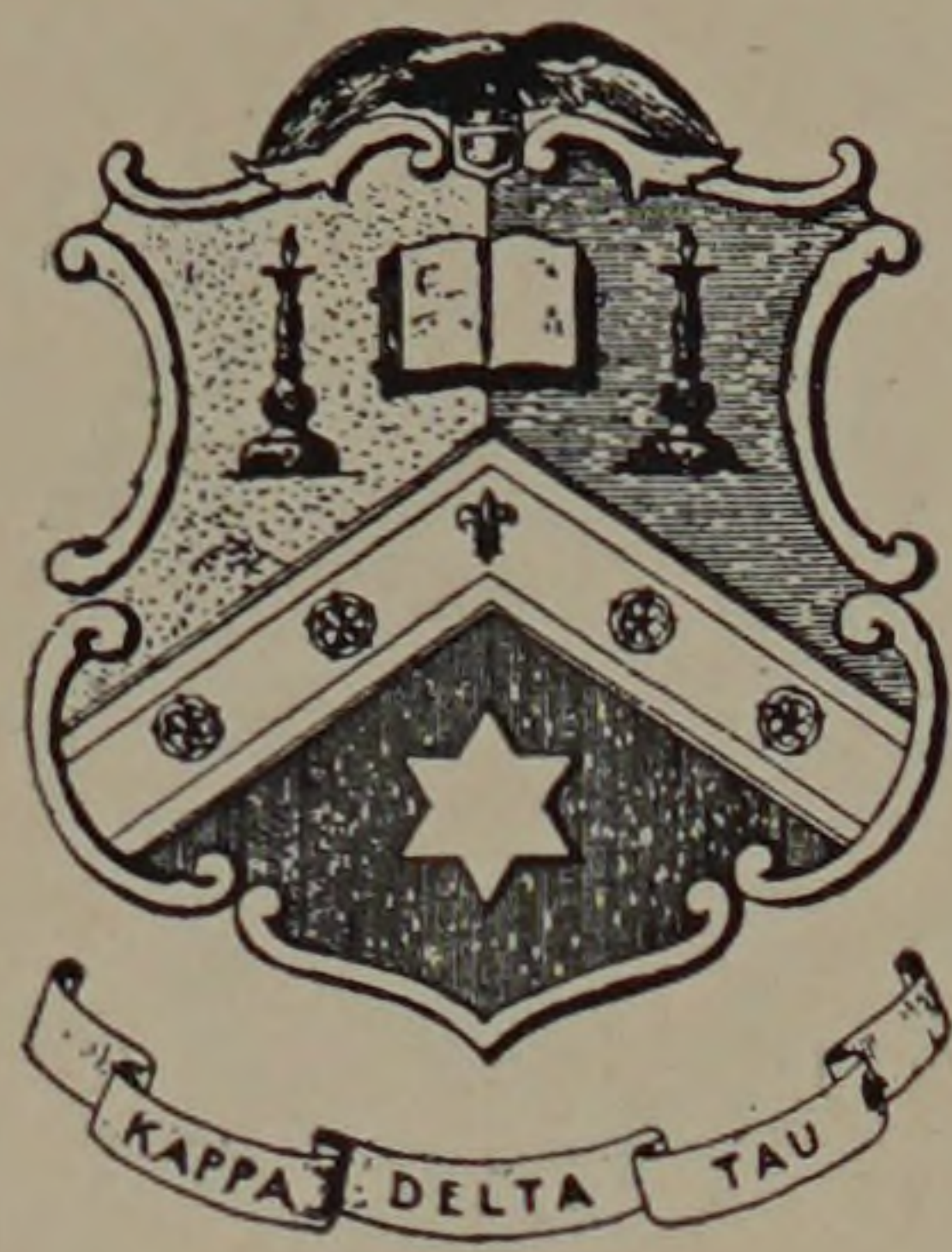

HISTORY

Kappa Delta Epsilon had its inception on March 19, 1922. This organization was given the name "Umen," taken from the ancient Hebrew. Its true meaning is "Builder," which thus portrays the ideals of the group gathered under its banner.

In 1926, in compliance with a suggestion from the Institute, the name was changed to the Greek letter term, Kappa Delta Tau. In 1931, the Fraternity was incorporated under the laws of the state of Illinois, and in order to avoid duplication of the name it was changed to Kappa Delta Epsilon.
