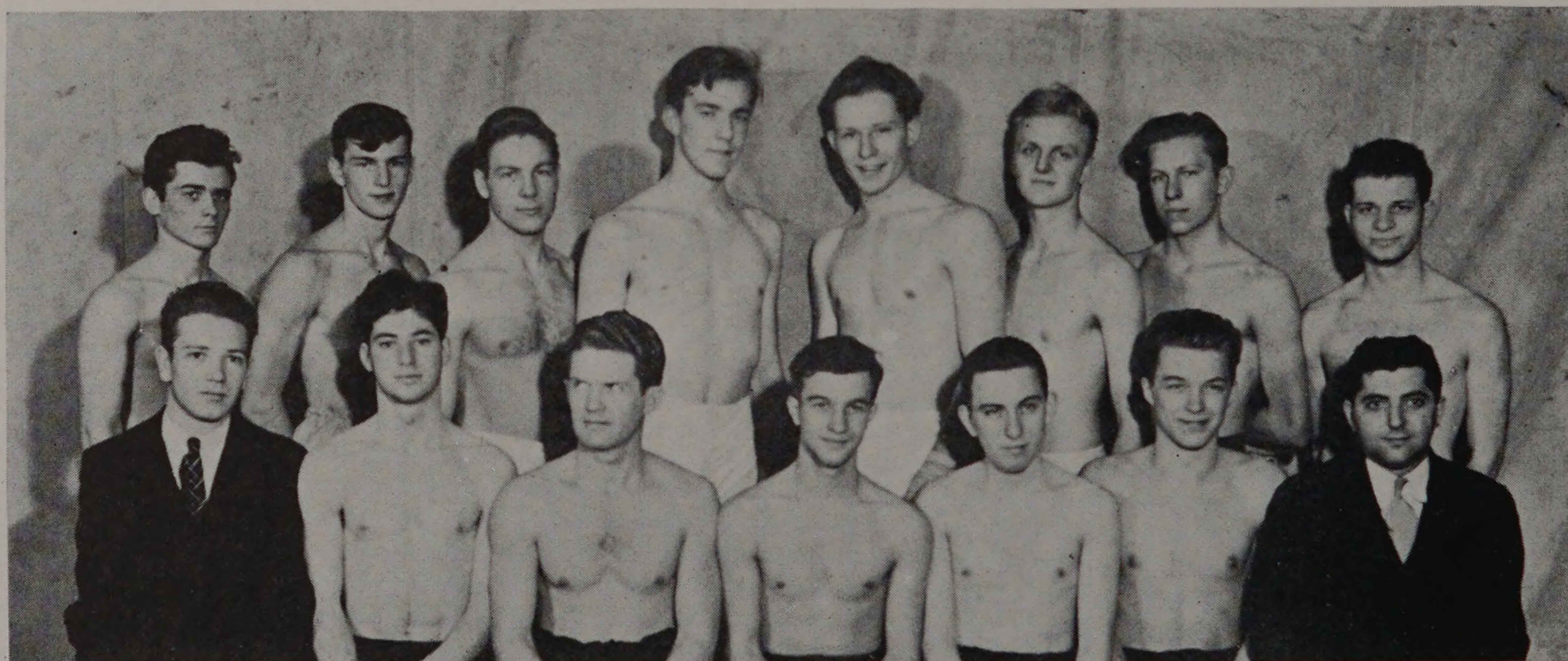
BOXING

The boxing team was a very promising one, and was composed of over fifteen men of experience and previous training. Seidenberg, Lindahl, Moore, Sramek, Stober, Mahnke, Norris, Chapin, Krok, Joerns, Way, Allegretti, Burman and Dittman comprised the working squad.

The season opened with the Tech boxers meeting Loyola on December 3. The Loyola boxers defeated the Engineers, 7-2. Allegretti, 134 pounds, lost the first bout by decision to Loyola's Herlicky, who evaded Allegretti's roundhouses and did most of the pushing about the ring. Popper, 160 pounds, challenged the hefty Lindenfield and jabbed him to the ropes, but tired later to take most of the punishment and the loss. Stober, 173 pounds, resisted Morrison's fourth-bout opening attack and with steady jabs and cautious dodges knocked him groggy enough to take the decision and a win for Armour. Dennis Malloy, 148 pounds, pride of Loyola, battled Moore with ingenious, quick technique, but Moore soon checked every advance of Malloy and landed blows himself. The third round found "Two-Gun" Malloy with both barrels empty and Moore rallying for Armour's second win. May, 126 pounds, lost a close battle to Eur of Loyola, being unable to resist Eur's wild swings. Mahnke, 160 pounds, pushed Dinklewater about the ring with his blows, but missed some wild stabs and the decision.
