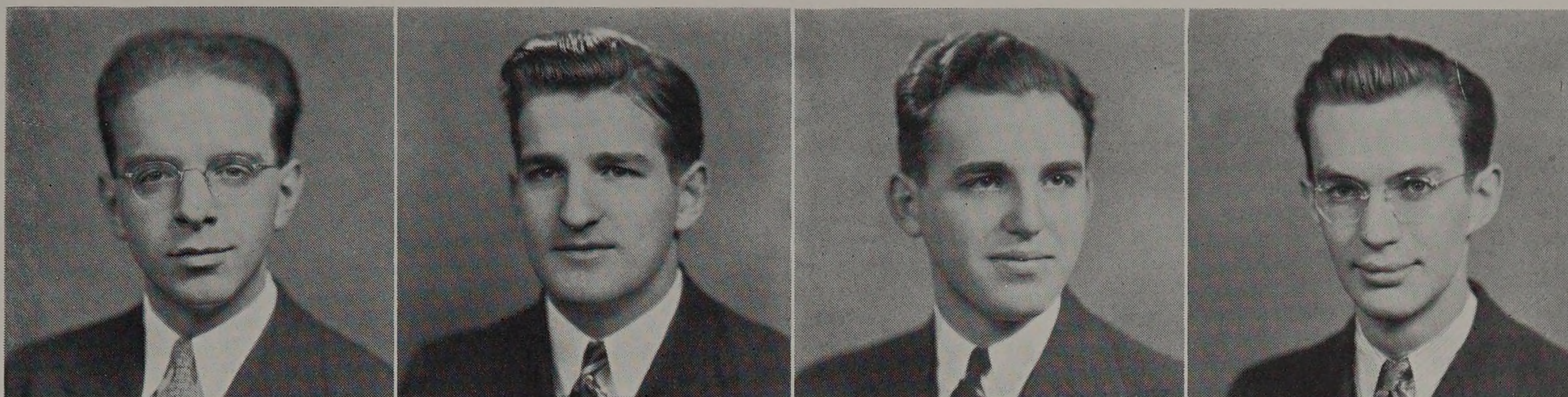
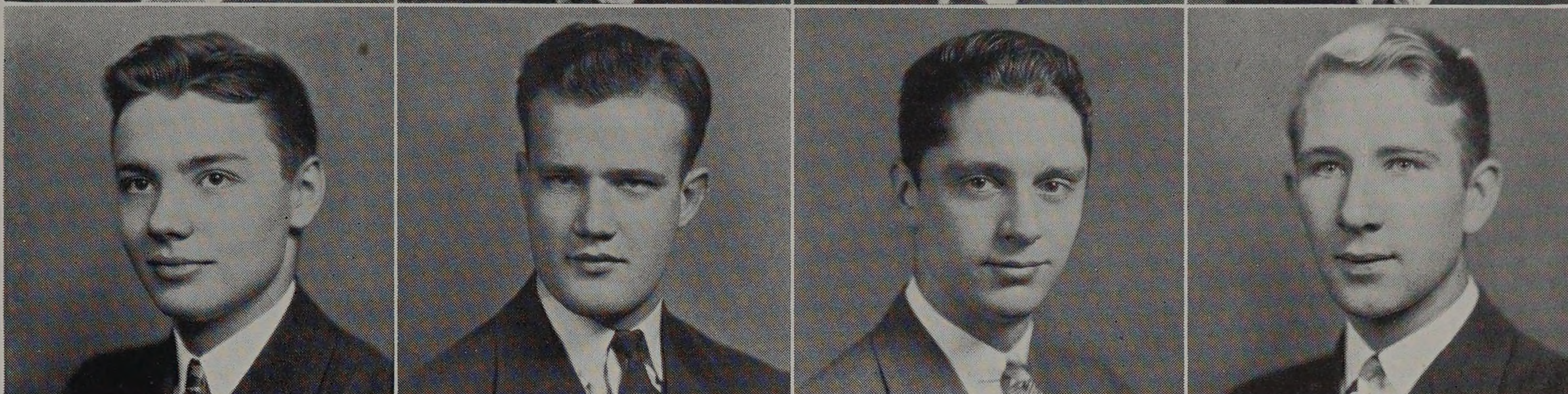


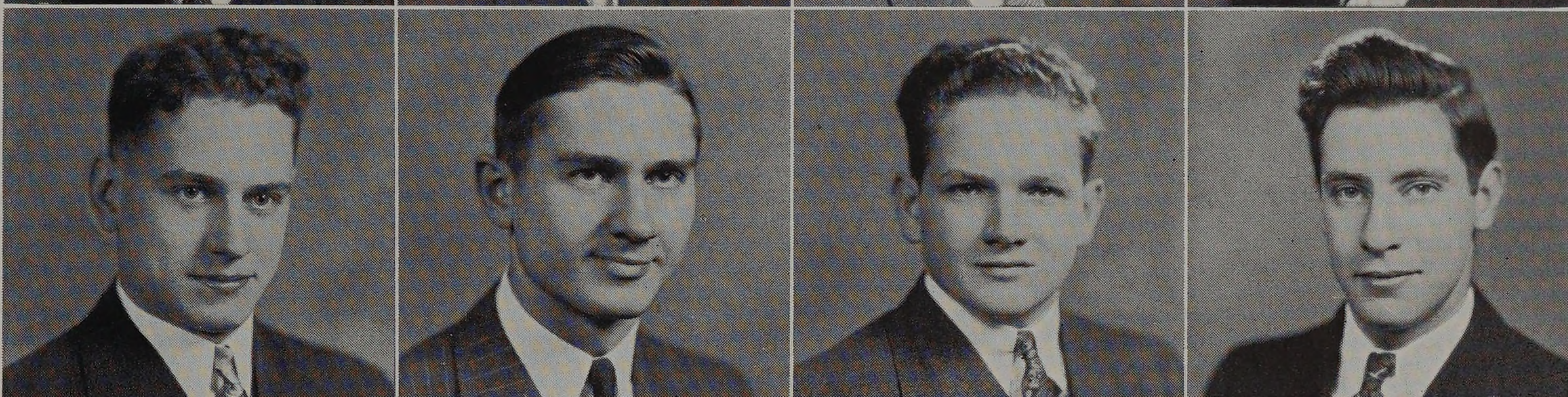

The oldest honor organization on the campus, Illinois Beta chapter of Tau Beta Pi, received its charter from the Tau Beta Pi Association in 1906. The chapter established at Armour became the fourteenth chapter of the national organization which now has over seventy-five active branches located at important colleges of engineering throughout the country. The first chapter of the national organization was founded at Lehigh University in 1885 "to mark in a fitting manner those who have conferred honor upon their Alma Mater by distinguished scholarship and exemplary character as undergraduates of engineering and to foster a spirit of liberal culture in the engineering colleges of America." Since the fraternity was founded, membership has been conferred upon some twenty thousand student and graduate engineers. Following the policies of the Tau Beta Pi Association, Illinois Beta chapter has been actively engaged in promoting and in aiding student engineering affairs and activities since it was chartered over thirty years ago. In addition to the student affairs and activities which interest the chapter, it spends considerable time in following the activities of graduate engineers striving to promote the cause of engineering. Representing a large, national, honorary fraternity and embracing all branches of engineering curriculum, the affairs and program of Illinois Beta have been followed as a model and have been a precedent for the activities of the local societies and organizations of Armour Institute.
