

Sphinx, honor literary society, was the first honorary society to be founded at Armour Institute. This organization was established in March, 1907, and it became the second honorary fraternity of the school. Previous to its formation, executive officers of the FULCHRUM, a pamphlet published monthly by Armour students, and the INTEGRAL, the college annual, united to coordinate the operations of the Armour publications. Members of this coordinating committee, seeking to foster and to promote publication work at the Institute and to honor those students who had rendered meritorious service to the Institute through literary accomplishments, ultimately founded Sphinx.

In 1909 the fraternity was successful in its efforts to found the ARMOUR ENGINEER. In February of 1929, Sphinx encouraged the establishment of a student newspaper. It strengthened this proposal with a guarantee of forty-five dollars which was intended to cover the cost of the first issue of the paper. It was this assurance of assistance that helped to establish the ARMOUR TECH NEWS.
