Phi Lambda Upsilon, honorary chemical society, was founded forty years ago by a group of senior chemistry students at the University of Illinois. Their object in starting this organization was the promotion of high scholarship and original investigation in all branches of pure and applied chemistry. The organization started slowly, the next chapter organized being at the University of Wisconsin in 1906. It has since grown phenomenally until at the present time there are thirty-six active chapters and nearly ten thousand members. The latest addition is a chapter at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, this year.

Omicron chapter was established at Armour Institute of Technology in 1920, largely through the efforts of two members of the chemical engineering department, Professor C. A. Tibbals and Mr. C. F. Smith. Admission to the society is limited to those members of the junior and senior classes in chemical engineering having the highest scholastic averages.
