The second non-engineering honorary fraternity to be founded at Armour, Pi Nu Epsilon, gives recognition to those students who have served commendably the musical organizations of the school. Establishment of the fraternity came only after officers of the Institute extended permission to the officials of the Armour Tech Musical Clubs to establish an honorary musical society. This new fraternity was the product of the members of the musical clubs, four of whom were members of the class of '27, four members of the class of '28, and Professor Emeritus Charles W. Leigh. The founders intended that the organization serve as a means of honoring students who had aided Armour musical work besides stimulating an interest among students in musical appreciation and interesting them in working for the musical clubs of the school. The charter was granted by Institute officials in January, 1927.

Not only have students and musical activities of the Institute been benefited by the fraternity, but the organization, being non-departmental, has tended to bring into closer contact students of the various departments.
