The most recent national fraternity to be instituted at Armour is a chapter of Rho Epsilon. Rho Epsilon was founded by the members of the Radio Club of Washington State College in December, 1911. Last April, 1938, a petition for a chapter of Rho Epsilon at Armour was presented to the officers of the fraternity. This petition was forwarded to the society by members of the former Armour Tech Radio Club. The application was accepted by the fraternity and a charter was granted as Epsilon Chapter in June, 1938.

The purpose of this organization is to encourage experimental radio activity among American College Students. The active membership chosen from the student body as a whole must consist of 80% government licensed men holding a Class "B" amateur radio license or better.

The call letters of this organization, W9YW, were obtained from the Federal Communications Commission in 1933. All Chapters of Rho Epsilon are a part of the National Intercollegiate Press Association.
