Phi Pi Phi was founded in Chicago in 1915 by four college graduates. The original intention was that the fraternity should be a graduate organization. The society retained its graduate standing until 1923, when the first undergraduate chapter was formed at Northwestern University. After Phi Pi Phi became an undergraduate social fraternity, it expanded carefully. Many of the new chapters were long established locally, and had a solid foundation along with campus traditions of their own. Some of these chapters had been in existence for thirty years before receiving their charter.

Four officers of the national council of the fraternity, elected by the biennial national convention, conduct the administrative affairs of the organization. The executive office is located in Chicago, the birthplace of the fraternity. The Interfraternity Conference, in 1924, elected Phi Pi Phi to a junior membership and in 1929 made it a senior member. The chapter roll now numbers twenty chapters.
