On November 19, 1939, the Civils decided to petition the American Society of Civil Engineers for a student chapter. This petition was submitted and was approved January 22, 1939. The installation was delayed by unexpected difficulties in the reorganization of the Armour branch of the Western Society of Engineers. Having these difficulties finally cleared up, the Armour student chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers was installed March 22, 1939.
