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

Fostering Synergy supports women in their most difficult stages of life. A young mother exiting the foster care system will be paired with a matriarch to form a living pod. The pair will help each other with daily activities and provide companionship and support. The senior woman will provide childcare services and parenting advice, while the young mother attends classes and/or works. In return the young mother will help with cleaning and grocery shopping. The development will be comprised of multiple living pods to create a support community. The community will provide a network of resources that go beyond the individual pair, branching out to other members of the community as needed.

The intention of the project is to create a community that fosters and supports social interaction and personal growth. The support of the community also helps by providing safe child care and help with daily activities such as cooking and cleaning. The intention of the development is to provide a safe living environment for all age groups that helps the inhabitants develop a sense of financial security and personal growth.

The Matrrole is to mothers. children, children

The **Matriarch** is an experienced, independant woman. Her role is to provide guidance and support to the young mothers. She acts as a role model for the young mothers' children, while strongly influencing the upbringing of the children both in the family unit and the community.



The **Young Mother** is a young woman, recently emancipated from the Foster Care system. She has one or more children. Her rold is to provide companionship to the Matriarchs, provide a safe family atmosphere for her child(ren), and become a fully functioning member of society.






The **Staff** are directly responsible for community center operations. They provide direct support and care for the occupants, while also offering services to the surrounding neighborhood.












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View D: Residential Courtyard, view of play area from second floor balcony
